Arlington National Cemetery

Filled with the casualties and deceased veterans of American conflicts dating back to the Civil War, this cemetery is home to the Women in Military Services for America Memorial, John F. Kennedy's "eternal flame" and the Tomb of the Unknown

Mount Vernon Mansion and Grounds**

George Washington's many passions, including farming, gardening, architecture, entertaining and family are brought to life at this Virginia estate.
